| | Multiplication Division Money Measure | We will be developing and consolidating a rang of mathematical skills to enable your child to become a confident mathematician! Learning will focus on: Solving multiplication and division problems by grouping or sharing, counting in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10. How to solve money problems, choose coins to make amounts, and give change. How to choose and use appropriate standard units to measure length, height, capacity, mass and temperature. |
