Home Learning

Reading - The children are expected to read at least 5 times a week at home either to you or independently. They then need to record this at least 3 times a week. We ask that you encourage your child to note down what they have enjoyed about their current text in their Home Learning Diary. They could record words that interested or confused them and/or a brief summary of the piece they have read. If you listen to them read, you may wish to make comments too.
